### Museums, river cruise or guided DC tours

## A. Museums selected by the Reunion Committee

- **-National Museum for Women in the Arts**

Now re-opened after a \$26 million renovation, this Museum is the first and only women's art museum in the world. It features art works from around the world by women, and it has had critically-acclaimed exhibits. 20 tickets are available through Irene Natividad, who has served on the Museum's board for over 20 years. This is within walking distance of the Grand Hyatt and Irene will walk with the group to meet a docent who will guide alumni throughout the visit. <https://nmwa.org/>

- **National Museum of African American History and Culture**

The most popular museum in the U.S., according to museum trackers, with visitors from at home and abroad surpassing the numbers of the National Gallery in DC and the Metropolitan Museum in New York, this institution was long-awaited and is worth the time to visit. There are 20 timed slots available and you must begin with the first floor and make your way up. <https://nmaahc.si.edu/>

- **National Air and Space Museum**

If you've ever wanted to see the capsules that carried U.S. astronauts to space and the moon, or wanted to know how small was the Spirit of St. Louis that crossed the Atlantic for the first time, then this museum is for you. The fourth most visited museum in the country is popular among visitors of all ages. There are 20 slots available. <https://airandspace.si.edu/>

- **National Museum of Asian Art.** Docent led tour of Ancient Iran

The Freer Gallery and the Arthur M. Sackler Gallery together form the National Museum of Asian Art. The Sackler Gallery features both permanent and temporary exhibitions from ancient times to the present, and is home to an incomparable collection of art, and some of the most important ancient Chinese jades and bronzes in the world. *Feast Your Eyes: A Taste for Luxury in Ancient Iran*: Exhibit at the Sackler, features a collection of luxury metalwork from Ancient Iran—an area extending from the eastern shores of the Mediterranean Sea to present-day Afghanistan. <https://asia.si.edu/>

- **U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum**

The United States Holocaust Memorial Museum (USHMM) is the U.S.'s official memorial to the Holocaust. Adjacent to the National Mall in Washington, D.C., as of Jan 2024, 47 million people from all over the world have visited the museum since its dedication in 1993. The museum's permanent exhibition takes you on a chronological journey from the rise of the Nazi party to the ghettoization and mass murder of Jews and, finally, to their liberation following the 1945 Allied victory. <https://www.ushmm.org/>

Board water taxi 2:15 pm for 2:30 pm sailing to Georgetown. Return to hotel on your own. (taxi is best).
